  (i) money appropriated in the State budget to the Fund; and
  (ii) any other money from any other source accepted for the benefit
  of the Fund.
- 30 **[**(7)**] (6)** The Fund may be used only for:

1(i) [administering] ADMINISTRATIVE EXPENSES OF the Program,2INCLUDING HIRING STAFF IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE STATE BUDGET AND HIRING3CONSULTANTS AND OTHER PROFESSIONALS AS NECESSARY TO IMPLEMENT,4MAINTAIN, AND ADMINISTER THE PROGRAM AND THE FUND; and

5 (ii) providing grants to elementary and secondary schools, 6 institutions of higher education, including community colleges, for-profit corporations, and 7 nonprofit organizations to operate cybersecurity programs based on the strategic plan of 8 the Program.

9 (7) THE CORPORATION SHALL ADOPT STANDARDS TO AWARD 10 GRANTS UNDER THIS SECTION.

11 (8) (i) The State Treasurer shall invest the money of the Fund in the 12 same manner as other State money may be invested.

(ii) Any interest earnings of the Fund shall be credited to theGeneral Fund of the State.

15 (9) Expenditures from the Fund may be made only in accordance with the16 State budget.

(10) For fiscal year 2025 and each year thereafter, the Governor may include
in the annual budget bill an appropriation of \$250,000 for the Fund.

(11) Subject to the availability of funding, for fiscal year 2025 and each year
 thereafter, \$250,000 of the Fund shall be used for implementing the U.S. Chamber of
 Commerce Talent Pipeline Management Approach.
