## 1 AN ACT concerning

2 Safe Sleep for Infants - Awareness and Certification
3 Hospitals - Care of Infants After Discharge
4 (Safe Sleep Act of 2024)

FOR the purpose of requiring the Maryland Department of Health to develop and 5 6 implement a public awareness campaign to promote education regarding safe sleep 7 for infants; establishing the Maryland Safe Sleep Certification Program and 8 requiring child care centers to be certified by the Program: requiring hospitals and 9 freestanding birthing centers to be certified by a certain safe sleep certification program; and generally relating to safe sleep for infants a hospital to take certain 10 11 actions relating to the care of infants as soon as practicable before the hospital discharges an infant after the birth of the infant, including providing oral and 12 written educational resources to the parent or legal guardian on how to provide a 13 14 safe sleep environment and providing a list of resources available for an infant's parent or legal guardian; requiring a hospital, on or before a certain date each year, 15 to establish a process for providing certain educational resources and confirming 16 17 receipt of the resources; requiring the Maryland Department of Health to develop a list of resources available for an infant's parent or legal guardian; and generally 18 relating to the care of infants after discharge from a hospital. 19
