1 AN ACT concerning

Comprehensive Flood Management Grant Program – Funding for Underserved and Overburdened Communities <u>and Areas at Extreme Risk of Flooding</u>

- FOR the purpose of requiring a certain percentage of funding provided under the comprehensive flood management grant program to be used for projects located in or directly benefiting underserved or overburdened communities <u>and certain other</u>
 <u>areas</u> in certain fiscal years; requiring <u>authorizing</u> the Governor to include in the annual State budget an appropriation for the comprehensive flood management
 grant program of at least a certain amount in certain fiscal years; and generally relating to the comprehensive flood management grant program.
