16 (f) (1) At least once every [4] 6 years, the Office of Legislative Audits shall 17 conduct a performance audit of the Board of Liquor License Commissioners for Baltimore 18 City to evaluate the effectiveness and efficiency of the management practices of the Board 19 and of the economy with which the Board uses resources.

20 (2) At any time on request of the President and the Speaker, the Office 21 shall conduct a performance audit of the local licensing board, as defined in § 1–101 of the 22 Alcoholic Beverages Article, for a county or for the City of Annapolis to evaluate the

3 (3) The performance audit shall focus on operations relating to liquor 4 inspections, licensing, disciplinary procedures, and management oversight.

5 (g) (1) [Beginning on July 1, 2017, and at least once every 3 years thereafter] 6 AT LEAST ONCE EVERY 6 YEARS, the Office of Legislative Audits shall conduct a 7 performance audit of the Board of License Commissioners for Prince George's County to 8 evaluate the effectiveness and efficiency of the management practices of the Board and of 9 the economy with which the Board uses resources.

10 (2) The performance audit shall focus on operations relating to liquor 11 inspections, licensing, disciplinary procedures, and management oversight.

12 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 13 October 1, 2024.
