- 7 REPRESENT PARTICIPATION OF A HISTORICALLY UNDERUTILIZED BUSINESS ZONE
- 8 BUSINESS IN ORDER TO OBTAIN OR RETAIN A BID PREFERENCE OR A PROCUREMENT
- 9 CONTRACT;
- 10 (3) WILLFULLY AND KNOWINGLY MAKE OR SUBSCRIBE TO ANY
- 11 STATEMENT, DECLARATION, OR OTHER DOCUMENT THAT IS FRAUDULENT OR FALSE
- 12 AS TO ANY MATERIAL MATTER, WHETHER OR NOT THAT FALSITY OR FRAUD IS
- 13 COMMITTED WITH THE KNOWLEDGE OR CONSENT OF THE PERSON AUTHORIZED OR
- 14 REQUIRED TO PRESENT THE DECLARATION, STATEMENT, OR DOCUMENT;
- 15 (4) WILLFULLY AND KNOWINGLY AID, ASSIST IN, PROCURE, COUNSEL,
- 16 OR ADVISE THE PREPARATION OR PRESENTATION OF A DECLARATION, STATEMENT,
- 17 OR OTHER DOCUMENT THAT IS FRAUDULENT OR FALSE AS TO ANY MATERIAL
- 18 MATTER, REGARDLESS OF WHETHER THAT FALSITY OR FRAUD IS COMMITTED WITH

- 21 (5) WILLFULLY AND KNOWINGLY FAIL TO FILE ANY DECLARATION OR
- 22 NOTICE WITH THE UNIT THAT IS REQUIRED BY THIS SUBTITLE; OR
- 23 (6) ESTABLISH, KNOWINGLY AID IN THE ESTABLISHMENT OF, OR
- 24 EXERCISE CONTROL OVER A BUSINESS FOUND TO HAVE VIOLATED A PROVISION OF
- 25 ITEMS (1) THROUGH (5) OF THIS SUBSECTION.

- 6 (C) THE BOARD SHALL PROHIBIT A BUSINESS OR PERSON WHO FAILS TO
 7 SATISFY THE PENALTIES, COSTS, AND ATTORNEY'S FEES IMPOSED UNDER
 8 SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION FROM FURTHER CONTRACTING WITH THE STATE
 9 UNTIL THE PENALTIES ARE SATISFIED.

 PERSON THAT WILLFULLY MISREPRESENTS A BUSINESS AS A HISTORICALLY
 UNDERUTILIZED BUSINESS ZONE BUSINESS FOR PURPOSES OF OBTAINING OR
 RETAINING A CONTRACT OR SUBCONTRACT MAY BE SUBJECT TO:
