

- 16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

- 21 requirements of this section.
- 22 (b) The applicant shall be of good moral character.

- 3 (d) The Board shall renew the license of and issue a renewal certificate to each 4 licensee who meets the requirements of this section.
- 5 (e) If an optometrist does not renew a license before its expiration date, the Board 6 shall send to the optometrist a notice stating that the license will expire 30 days after the 7 notice is sent unless the optometrist applies for renewal within the grace period.
- 8 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 9 October 1, 2024.
