- 20 make periodic recommendations on investments in State information (2)21technology structures based on the assessments completed in accordance with the 22framework developed in § 3.5–317 of this subtitle; AND
- 23review and provide recommendations on the Department's basic (3)security standards for use of the network established under § 3.5–404(b) of this title; and 24
- 25[(4)] (3) each year, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the State Government 26Article, report its findings and recommendations to the **SECRETARY**, Senate Budget and Taxation Committee, the Senate [Education, Health, and Environmental Affairs 2728 Committee COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION, ENERGY, AND THE ENVIRONMENT, the
- 29 House Appropriations Committee, the House Health and Government Operations
- 30 Committee, and the Joint Committee on Cybersecurity, Information Technology, and
- 31 Biotechnology.
- The report submitted under subsection [(f)(4)] (F)(3) of this section may not 32 33 contain information about the security of an information system.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2024.
