BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Public Safety Section 8–201 Annotated Code of Maryland (2022 Replacement Volume and 2023 Supplement) BY repealing and reenacting, without amendments, Article – Public Safety Section 8–206 Annotated Code of Maryland (2022 Replacement Volume and 2023 Supplement) SECTION 1.
