A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Natural Resources - Maryland State Parks - Funds and Plan Alterations

- 3 FOR the purpose of extending the date by which the Park System Critical Maintenance 4 Fund must be expended; authorizing the Park System Capital Improvements and 5 Acquisition Fund to be used for State projects on lands managed by the Department 6 of Natural Resources for public purposes; altering the allowable uses of funds for the 7 initial allocation to the Park System Capital Improvements and Acquisition Fund; 8 authorizing the Great Maryland Outdoors Fund to be used for promoting outdoor 9 environmental education in the State; extending the date by which the Department 10 is required to develop and publish a Comprehensive Long-Range Strategic Plan; and 11 generally relating to the State park system.

- 22 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 23 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 3 (b) There is a Park System Critical Maintenance Fund.
- 4 (c) The purpose of the Fund is to provide funding for completing State projects that address critical maintenance concerns on lands managed by the Department for public purposes.
- 7 (g) The Fund may be used only for State park projects that address critical 8 maintenance concerns on lands managed by the Department for public purposes.
- 9 (k) (1) For fiscal year 2024 only, the Governor shall include in the annual budget bill a General Fund appropriation in the amount of \$70,000,000 to the Fund for State projects that address critical maintenance concerns on lands managed by the Department for public purposes.
- 13 (2) The Department shall expend the funds allocated under this subsection 14 before July 1, [2026] **2029**.

- 16 (a) In this section, "Fund" means the Park System Capital Improvements and 17 Acquisition Fund.
- 18 (b) There is a Park System Capital Improvements and Acquisition Fund.
- 19 (c) The purpose of the Fund is to provide funding for:
- 20 (1) Completing State [park] projects related to capital improvements on lands managed by the Department for public purposes; and
- 22 (2) Acquiring land to be managed by the Department for public purposes 23 [as a State park].
- 24 (g) The Fund may be used only for:
- 25 (1) Completing State [park] projects related to capital improvements on lands managed by the Department for public purposes; and
- 27 (2) Acquiring land to be managed by the Department for public purposes 28 [as a State park].

PUBLIC PURPOSES is supplemental to and is not intended to take the place of funding 1 2 that otherwise would be appropriated for capital improvements [in the State's parks] FOR 3 STATE PROJECTS ON LANDS MANAGED BY THE DEPARTMENT FOR PUBLIC 4 **PURPOSES** and the acquisition of land by the Department that will be managed for public purposes. 5 6 (1)The first \$70,000,000 received by the Fund may be used only as follows: 7 AT LEAST \$5,000,000 for infrastructure projects that mitigate the (1)8 effects of climate change, including: 9 Flood barriers; (i) 10 Forest buffers: (ii) 11 (iii) Green spaces; 12(iv) Building elevation; 13 (v) Stormwater infrastructure; Wetlands restoration; and 14 (vi) 15 (vii) Addressing environmental justice concerns; 16 AT LEAST \$5,000,000 for historic preservation, in accordance with 17 subsection (m) of this section; **AT LEAST** \$20,000,000 for transportation improvements, including: 18 (3)19 Improving bike lanes and trails, increasing walkability, and (i) 20expanding parking availability; and 21(ii) Targeting transportation investments to avoid capacity 22shutdowns: 23AT LEAST \$10,000,000 for increasing water access, including kayak (4) 24and boat launches and areas for picnicking near water and swimming; and 25 **UP TO** \$30,000,000 for land acquisition, including: (5)26 (i) Areas in the central and southern regions of the State that will: 27 1. Relieve overcrowding at existing State parks; and 28 2. Expand public access to State parks and outdoor

(a) 7 (b) There is a Great Maryland Outdoors Fund in the Department. 8 The purpose of the Fund is to: (c) Support the Office of Outdoor Recreation in the Department; 9 (1) 10 (2)Provide resources to improve existing and create new outdoor 11 recreation AND OUTDOOR ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION opportunities; [and] 12 (3)Implement the recommendations of the Maryland Outdoor Recreation 13 Economic Commission to promote and grow the outdoor recreation sector in the State; AND 14 **(4)** PROMOTE AND GROW OUTDOOR ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION IN THE STATE. 15 16 The Fund may be used only for: (g) 17 (1) Implementing the recommendations of the Maryland Outdoor 18 Recreation Economic Commission, including establishing and supporting an Office of 19 Outdoor Recreation in the Department]: 20 (2)Department projects and programs that provide, promote, and enhance

- 2 (1) Develop and publish a Comprehensive Long-Range Strategic Plan by 3 December 1, [2023] **2024**;
- 4 (2) Update the Comprehensive Long-Range Strategic Plan every 5 years 5 to reflect major goals and progress toward meeting those goals; and
- 6 (3) Submit to the General Assembly, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the 7 State Government Article, the Comprehensive Long–Range Strategic Plan and any updates 8 to the plan.
- 9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 10 October 1, 2024.
