3 FOR the purpose of extending the date by which the Park System Critical Maintenance 4 Fund must be expended; authorizing the Department of Natural Resources to expend  $\mathbf{5}$ up to a certain amount from the Park System Critical Maintenance Fund under certain circumstances; authorizing the Park System Capital Improvements and 6 7 Acquisition Fund to be used for State projects on lands managed by the Department 8 of Natural Resources for public purposes; altering the allowable uses of funds for the 9 initial allocation to the Park System Capital Improvements and Acquisition Fund; 10 authorizing the Great Maryland Outdoors Fund to be used for promoting outdoor environmental education in the State; requiring the Department to report certain 11 expenditures to the Parks and Recreation Commission at certain meetings; 12 extending the date by which the Department is required to develop and publish a 13 Comprehensive Long-Range Strategic Plan; and generally relating to the State park 1415system.
