A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Commission on African American History and Culture – Museum Name Change

- 3 FOR the purpose of altering the name of a certain museum operated by the Commission on
- 4 African American History and Culture in certain provisions of law; and generally
- 5 relating to the museum operated by the Commission on African American History
- 6 and Culture.
- 7 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,
- 8 Article State Government
- 9 Section 9–3707 and 9–3708
- 10 Annotated Code of Maryland
- 11 (2021 Replacement Volume and 2023 Supplement)
- 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 13 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 14 Article State Government
- 15 9–3707.
- 16 (a) The Commission shall:
- 17 (1) initiate, direct, and coordinate projects that further the understanding
- 18 of African American history and culture;
- 19 (2) receive and administer any available federal, State, or private money
- 20 to plan and execute projects or educational activities that further the understanding of
- 21 African American history and culture;

- 1 (3) operate the [Banneker–Douglass] BANNEKER–DOUGLASS–TUBMAN 2 Museum in Annapolis to house and display photographs, objects, oral history tapes, 3 artifacts, and other materials of African American historic and cultural significance;
- 4 (4) locate, preserve, and disseminate to the public information about 5 significant buildings and sites relating to African American history and culture; and
- 6 (5) publish an annual report and any other material that the Commission 7 considers necessary.
- 8 (b) The Commission may provide operational funding to a museum that 9 specializes in African American history and culture.
- 10 9-3708.
- 11 (a) (1) The Commission may seek money from the federal government, 12 foundations, and private sources in addition to State financing.
- 13 (2) The Commission may accept gifts, grants, donations, bequests, or 14 endowments for any of its purposes.
- 15 (b) Money received under subsection (a) of this section, income from the operation 16 of the [Banneker–Douglass] **BANNEKER–DOUGLASS–TUBMAN** Museum, and money 17 from educational materials and activities of the Commission are not subject to § 7–302 of 18 the State Finance and Procurement Article.
- 19 (c) For each fiscal year, the Governor shall include in the annual budget bill an 20 appropriation of \$1,600,000 for the Commission.
- 21 (d) Money maintained under this section is subject to audit by the State, including 22 the Legislative Auditor.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2024.
