20 21	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 3 (c) "Vision Zero" means a program for planning and developing a State roadway 4 system that has zero vehicle—related deaths or serious injuries.

- 6 There is a program within the Department known as Vision Zero.
- 7 8–1003.
- 8 (a) The purpose of Vision Zero is to develop strategies to make roadways safer for 9 drivers and passengers of motor vehicles, bicyclists, and pedestrians.
- 10 (b) The goal of Vision Zero is to have zero vehicle—related deaths or serious 11 injuries on roadways by the year 2030.

- 13 (a) On or before December 31 each year, the Department shall submit a report
- 14 [on the status of Vision Zero] to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the State
- 15 Government Article, the General Assembly THAT INCLUDES:
- 16 (1) THE STATUS OF VISION ZERO; AND
- 17 (2) THE FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE VISION ZERO ADVISORY COMMISSION ESTABLISHED UNDER § 8–1008 OF THIS SUBTITLE.
- 19 (b) The Department shall make the report required under subsection (a) of this 20 section available on its website.

- 20 (E) TO THE EXTENT PRACTICABLE, THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE COMMISSION
- 21 SHALL REFLECT THE RACIAL, ETHNIC, GEOGRAPHIC, GENDER, AND ECONOMIC

- 23 (F) THE GOVERNOR SHALL DESIGNATE THE CHAIR OF THE COMMISSION.

- 1 (H) (1) THIS SUBSECTION APPLIES ONLY TO COMMISSION MEMBERS 2 APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER SUBSECTION (D)(11) OF THIS SECTION.
- 3 (2) EXCEPT FOR THE INITIAL TERMS OF THE COMMISSION MEMBERS, 4 THE TERM OF A MEMBER IS 4 YEARS.
- 5 (3) THE TERMS OF MEMBERS ARE STAGGERED AS REQUIRED BY THE 6 TERMS PROVIDED FOR MEMBERS OF THE COMMISSION ON OCTOBER 1, 2024.
- 7 (4) AT THE END OF A TERM, A MEMBER CONTINUES TO SERVE UNTIL 8 A SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED AND QUALIFIES.
- 9 (5) A MEMBER WHO IS APPOINTED AFTER A TERM HAS BEGUN SERVES 10 ONLY FOR THE REST OF THE TERM AND UNTIL A SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED AND 11 QUALIFIES.
- 12 (6) A MEMBER MAY BE REAPPOINTED, BUT AFTER SERVING TWO
 13 CONSECUTIVE TERMS, A MEMBER MAY NOT BE REAPPOINTED UNTIL AT LEAST 1
 14 YEAR AFTER THE END OF THE MEMBER'S SECOND TERM.
- 15 (I) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PROVIDE STAFF FOR THE COMMISSION.
- 16 (J) A MEMBER OF THE COMMISSION:
- 17 (1) MAY NOT RECEIVE COMPENSATION AS A MEMBER OF THE 18 COMMISSION; BUT
- 19 (2) IS ENTITLED TO REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES UNDER THE 20 STANDARD STATE TRAVEL REGULATIONS, AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET.

- 2 (3) REVIEW SAFETY DEFICIENCIES AT CRASH SITES WHERE THERE
- 3 HAVE BEEN THREE OR MORE FATALITIES WITHIN 12 MONTHS, INCLUDING
- 4 DEFICIENCIES IDENTIFIED BY INFRASTRUCTURE REVIEWS CONDUCTED UNDER §
- **5 8–204.2** OF THIS TITLE; AND
- 6 (4) PROVIDE GUIDANCE ON ANY OTHER ISSUE DIRECTLY RELATED TO 7 ROADWAY SAFETY.
- 8 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the terms of the initial 9 members of the Vision Zero Advisory Commission appointed by the Governor under §
- 10 8–1008(d)(11) of the Transportation Article, as enacted by Section 1 of this Act, shall expire
- 11 as follows:
- 12 (1) eight members in 2026;
- 13 (2) eight members in 2027; and
- 14 (3) seven members in 2028.
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 16 October 1, 2024.
