- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 (a) In this section, "strangling" means impeding the normal breathing or blood 16 circulation of another person by applying pressure to the other person's throat or neck.

17 (b) (1) A person may not intentionally cause or attempt to cause serious 18 physical injury to another.

19(2)A person may not INTENTIONALLY commit an assault with a firearm,20including:

(i) a handgun, antique firearm, rifle, shotgun, short–barreled shotgun, or short–barreled rifle, as those terms are defined in § 4–201 of this article;



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(ii) an assault pistol, as defined in § 4–301 of this article;
 (iii) a machine gun, as defined in § 4–401 of this article; and
 (iv) a regulated firearm, as defined in § 5–101 of the Public Safety
 Article.

5 (3) A person may not commit an assault by intentionally strangling 6 another.

7 (c) A person who violates this section is guilty of the felony of assault in the first 8 degree and on conviction is subject to imprisonment not exceeding 25 years.

9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 10 October 1, 2024.

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
