BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Correctional Services Section 8–204 Annotated Code of Maryland (2017 Replacement Volume and 2023 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: **Article - Correctional Services** 8-204.IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS (a) **(1)** INDICATED. "CAPITAL REGION" MEANS FREDERICK COUNTY, MONTGOMERY **(2)** COUNTY, AND PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY.

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[(c)] (D) Except for the [four] FIVE members appointed by the Governor under subsection [(b)] (C) of this section, a member of the Commission may serve personally at a Commission meeting or designate a representative from the member's unit or association who may act at any meeting to the same effect as if the member were personally present.
