

Motor Vehicles – Work Zone Speed Control Systems – Revisions (Maryland Road Worker Protection Act of 2024)

4 FOR the purpose of altering the distribution of revenue from civil fines collected through the use of work zone speed control systems to include certain distributions for 5 6 highway and work zone safety purposes; clarifying the highways on which a work 7 zone speed control system may be used; clarifying that a work zone speed control 8 system may be manned or unmanned and a system operator does not need to be 9 present when a work zone speed control system is in use; clarifying that multiple 10 work zone speed control systems may be implemented and used in a work zone; 11 altering the maximum penalty for a civil citation issued as a result of a recorded 12 image produced by a work zone speed control system; repealing a requirement that warning notices be issued for violations recorded by a work zone speed control system 13 14 during certain periods of time; and generally relating to work zone speed control 15 systems.
