1 AN ACT concerning

2 State Retirement and Pension System – Transfers of Service <u>Credit</u>

FOR the purpose of repealing a requirement for certain transfers of service to be calculated
under a certain formula; correcting a reference to a contribution rate for transfers of
service into the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System; providing for eligibility
and service credit in the Employees' Pension System for certain contractual
employment by certain members; and generally relating to the transfer of service
credit in the State Retirement and Pension System.
