CHAPTER

1 AN ACT concerning

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Community Colleges - Contraception - Access Requirements

3 FOR the purpose of requiring, on or before eertain dates a certain date, each community college to develop and implement a plan to provide students with access to 4 5 over-the-counter contraception; requiring each community college to submit a 6 certain report to the Maryland Higher Education Commission each year; requiring 7 the Commission to submit a certain report to the General Assembly each year; authorizing the Maryland Department of Health, on request, to provide certain 8 9 assistance to a community college; and generally relating to community colleges and 10 contraception access requirements.

- 16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

- 1 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "OVER-THE-COUNTER CONTRACEPTION" MEANS A CONTRACEPTIVE DRUG OR DEVICE APPROVED BY THE FEDERAL FOOD AND DRUG ADMINISTRATION THAT CAN BE OBTAINED FOR USE WITHOUT A PRESCRIPTION.
- 4 (B) (1) (I) ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 1, 2024 AUGUST 1, 2025, EACH 5 COMMUNITY COLLEGE, IN CONSULTATION WITH STUDENTS AND STUDENT 6 ORGANIZATIONS, SHALL DEVELOP AND IMPLEMENT A PLAN TO PROVIDE STUDENTS 7 WITH ACCESS TO OVER-THE-COUNTER CONTRACEPTION.
- 8 (II) ON OR BEFORE AUGUST 1, 2025, EACH COMMUNITY
 9 COLLEGE SHALL IMPLEMENT THE PLAN DEVELOPED UNDER SUBPARAGRAPH (I) OF
 10 THIS PARAGRAPH.
- 11 (2) THE PLAN UNDER PARAGRAPH (1)(1) OF THIS SUBSECTION 12 SHALL INCLUDE ACCESS TO OVER—THE—COUNTER CONTRACEPTION THROUGH:
- 13 (I) THE STUDENT HEALTH CENTER;
- 14 (II) RETAIL ESTABLISHMENTS ON CAMPUS;
- 15 (III) VENDING MACHINES; OR
- 16 (IV) ANY OTHER METHOD THAT PROVIDES ALL STUDENTS 17 ACCESS WHEN ON CAMPUS.
- 18 (C) (1) ON OR BEFORE SEPTEMBER 1, 2025, AND EACH SEPTEMBER 1
 19 THEREAFTER, ON A FORM PROVIDED BY THE COMMISSION, EACH COMMUNITY
 20 COLLEGE SHALL SUBMIT A REPORT TO THE COMMISSION ON IMPLEMENTATION OF
 21 THE PLAN REQUIRED UNDER THIS SECTION, INCLUDING:
- 22 (I) HOW STUDENTS ARE PROVIDED ACCESS TO 23 OVER-THE-COUNTER CONTRACEPTION ON CAMPUS;
- 24 (II) AVAILABLE INFORMATION REGARDING THE AMOUNT OF 25 OVER-THE-COUNTER CONTRACEPTION PROVIDED ON CAMPUS; AND
- 26 (III) A DESCRIPTION OF HOW THE COMMUNITY COLLEGE HAS CONSULTED WITH STUDENTS AND STUDENT ORGANIZATIONS TO DEVELOP AND IMPLEMENT THE PLAN UNDER THIS SECTION.
- 29 (2) On or before October 1, 2025, and each October 1 30 Thereafter, the Commission shall report to the General Assembly, in 31 Accordance with § 2–1257 of the State Government Article, on the

6 7 8	(2) CONSULTING AND COLLABORATING WITH ORGANIZATIONS WITH EXPERTISE IN PROVIDING ACCESS TO OVER-THE-COUNTER CONTRACEPTION THROUGH VENDING MACHINES.

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Maryland Higher Education Commission shall ensure that the focus of the report due to the General Assembly on or before October 1, 2025, under § 16–111 of the Education Article, as enacted by Section 1 of this Act, shall be on the implementation plans of community colleges that have not implemented the institution's access to over—the—counter contraception on or before August 1, 2025.
