4 FOR the purpose of requiring a water utility operating in the State to post on its website 5 or provide to the Department of the Environment certain documents, data, and 6 information; requiring a certain local government to provide or post on its website 7 certain data and information to a certain water utility; prohibiting the Department 8 from imposing more than a certain amount in fines on certain water utilities for each 9 reporting year; requiring the revenues from the fines imposed on water utilities that fail to report certain documents, data, or information to be distributed to a special 10 11 fund; and generally relating to the collection and reporting of water data.

- 1 (A) (1) A WATER UTILITY THAT FAILS TO REPORT OR POST ON ITS 2 WEBSITE THE DOCUMENTS, DATA, OR INFORMATION REQUIRED UNDER THIS 3 SUBTITLE IS SUBJECT TO A CIVIL PENALTY UNDER THIS SECTION.
- 4 (2) (I) SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPHS (3) AND (4) OF THIS SUBSECTION, A WATER UTILITY THAT PROVIDES SERVICE TO 3,301 OR MORE CUSTOMERS IN A SERVICE AREA THAT FAILS TO REPORT OR POST ON ITS WEBSITE THE DOCUMENTS, DATA, OR INFORMATION REQUIRED UNDER THIS SUBTITLE IS SUBJECT TO A FINE NOT EXCEEDING \$1,000 FOR EACH 15 DAYS THAT PASS:

- 2. Until the water utility provides or posts on its website the required documents, data, or information.
- (II) SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPHS (3) AND (4) OF THIS SUBSECTION, A WATER UTILITY THAT PROVIDES SERVICE TO BETWEEN 501 AND 3,300 CUSTOMERS IN A SERVICE AREA THAT FAILS TO REPORT OR POST ON ITS WEBSITE THE DOCUMENTS, DATA, OR INFORMATION REQUIRED UNDER THIS SUBTITLE IS SUBJECT TO A FINE NOT EXCEEDING \$500 FOR EACH 30 DAYS THAT PASS:

- 21 UNTIL THE WATER UTILITY PROVIDES OR POSTS ON 22 ITS WEBSITE THE REQUIRED DOCUMENTS, DATA, OR INFORMATION.

- 14 (III) \$500 IN FINES ON A WATER UTILITY THAT PROVIDES
- 15 SERVICE TO 500 OR FEWER CUSTOMERS IN A SERVICE AREA.
- 16 (B) (1) THE REVENUES FROM THE FINES IMPOSED UNDER THIS SECTION
- 17 SHALL BE DISTRIBUTED TO A SPECIAL FUND, TO BE USED ONLY FOR ENSURING
- 18 HOUSEHOLDS WITH A LOW INCOME HAVE ACCESS TO DRINKING WATER AND
- 19 WASTEWATER SERVICES.
- 20 (2) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS FOR EXPENDING
- 21 THE REVENUE IN THE SPECIAL FUND UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION.
