BY repealing and reenacting, without amendments, Article – State Finance and Procurement Section 14–301(a) Annotated Code of Maryland (2021 Replacement Volume and 2023 Supplement) BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – State Finance and Procurement Section 14–301(e–1) and 14–305 Annotated Code of Maryland (2021 Replacement Volume and 2023 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

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

(a) (e-1) "Industry type" means the following procurement categories: 4 (1) 5 construction; 6 (2)architectural and engineering services and other construction-related professional services; 7 8 (3)maintenance; 9 **(4)** information technology; services; [and] 10 (5)11 goods, supplies, and equipment; AND (6) 12 REAL PROPERTY TITLE SERVICES TITLE INSURANCE SERVICES, **(7)** 13 INCLUDING COMMERCIAL REAL PROPERTY TITLE INSURANCE SERVICES. 14 14-305. 15 Within 90 days after the end of the fiscal year, each unit shall report to (1) the Governor's Office of Small, Minority, and Women Business Affairs and the certification 16 17 agency. 18 (2)A report under this subsection shall for the preceding fiscal year: 19 state the total number and value of procurement contracts 20 between the unit and certified minority business enterprises, by specific category of minority business enterprise and by industry type, including whether the minority 21 22business enterprise participated as a prime contractor or as a subcontractor; 23 indicate the percentage that those procurement contracts (ii) 24represent, by specific category of minority business enterprise and by industry type, of the total number and value of procurement contracts; 25 26 state the total number and the names of certified minority 27 business enterprises that participated as prime contractors or as subcontractors on

procurement contracts awarded by a unit;

- 5 low for the unit to provide sufficient data.
- 6 (b) (1) On or before December 31 of each year, the Governor's Office of Small,
 7 Minority, and Women Business Affairs shall submit to the Board of Public Works and,
 8 subject to § 2–1257 of the State Government Article, to the Legislative Policy Committee
 9 and the Joint Committee on Fair Practices and State Personnel Oversight a report
- 10 summarizing the information the Office receives under subsection (a) of this section.
- 11 (2) If applicable, the report submitted under paragraph (1) of this 12 subsection shall include minority business enterprise participation data for each unit by 13 industry type.
- 14 (3) This report may be prepared in conjunction with the annual report 15 required under § 9–306 of the State Government Article.
- 16 (4) (i) Beginning with the report submitted under paragraph (1) of this subsection on December 31, 2023, and each year thereafter, the Governor's Office of Small, Minority, and Women Business Affairs shall include in the report an attestation that all units required to report under subsection (a) of this section are represented in the report.
- 20 (ii) To ensure accuracy of the attestation made under subparagraph 21 (i) of this paragraph, on or before December 31, 2023, and every 3 years thereafter, the 22 Governor's Office of Small, Minority, and Women Business Affairs shall conduct an audit 23 of the Executive Branch of State government to determine what entities are included in the 24 definition of "unit" under § 11–101 of this article.
- 25 (c) (1) In this subsection, "mitigating factors" includes documented 26 nonperformance or unavailability of a minority business enterprise designated for a 27 contract.
- 28 (2) The Governor's Office of Small, Minority, and Women Business Affairs 29 and the Office of State Procurement in the Department of General Services, in consultation 30 with the Office of the Attorney General and the Board of Public Works, shall adopt by 31 regulation criteria used to determine that a prime contractor has persistently failed to meet 32 contract goals in the absence of mitigating factors.
- 33 (3) The criteria adopted under paragraph (2) of this subsection shall include the results of the compliance assessments made under subsection (a)(2)(v) of this section.
- 36 (4) The Governor's Office of Small, Minority, and Women Business Affairs 37 shall refer prime contractors identified under the criteria adopted under paragraph (2) of
