8	SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Prince George's County shall:
9	(1) review and make recommendations on the impact of the school facilities
10	surcharge and the public safety surcharge and the need for any changes to the surcharges,
11	including whether changes to the school facilities surcharge and the public safety surcharge
12	might have a positive impact on the ability to construct and maintain affordable housing;
13	and
14	(2) on or before December 1, [2022] 2026, report its findings to the Prince
15	George's County Council, the Prince George's County School Board, and, in accordance with
16	§ 2–1246 of the State Government Article, the members of the Prince George's County
17	<u>Delegation to the General Assembly.</u>
18	SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
19	1, 2019. Sections 2 and 3 of this Act shall remain effective for a period of [5] 10 years and,
20	at the end of June 30, [2024] 2029, Sections 2 and 3 of this Act, with no further action
21	required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
