- 13 (A) THERE IS A MARYLAND PATHWAY TO NURSING PILOT PROGRAM IN 14 THE DEPARTMENT COMMISSION.
- 15 (B) THE GOALS OF THE PROGRAM ARE TO:
- 16 (1) SUPPORT STUDENTS IN LICENSED PRACTICAL NURSING
- 17 EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS WHO INTEND TO PRACTICE LICENSED PRACTICAL

- 1 (5) PROVIDE PROGRAM PARTICIPANTS WITH FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE 2 TO COVER THE COST OF:
- 3 (I) COMPUTERS, TEXTBOOKS, AND OTHER SUPPLIES AND 4 ADDITIONAL EDUCATION SUPPORT SERVICES; AND
- 5 (II) WRAPAROUND SUPPORT SERVICES THAT PROVIDE 6 ASSISTANCE WITH TRANSPORTATION, CHILD CARE, ELDER CARE, AND OTHER 7 LIVING EXPENSES THAT POSE A BARRIER TO STUDENTS SUCCESSFULLY 8 COMPLETING THE STUDENT'S EDUCATIONAL REQUIREMENTS.
- 9 (C) THE SECRETARY, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE, 10 SHALL DETERMINE THE FOLLOWING FOR THE PROGRAM:
- 11 (1) THE TIME FRAME AND STEPS NECESSARY TO ESTABLISH THE 12 PROGRAM;
- 13 (2) The areas of the State in which the Program will 14 operate;
- 15 (3) FUNDING TO SUPPORT THE PROGRAM, INCLUDING A STRATEGY
 16 FOR SUSTAINABILITY THROUGH BRAIDED FUNDING FROM LOCAL WORKFORCE
 17 DEVELOPMENT BOARDS, LOCAL HEALTH CARE SYSTEMS, AND FEDERAL GRANTS;
- 18 (4) THE RESOURCES NECESSARY TO SUPPORT THE PROGRAM; AND
- 19 (5) THE TYPES OF EVALUATIONS, INCLUDING OBTAINING FEEDBACK 20 FROM STUDENTS AND EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS, NEEDED TO MAKE 21 RECOMMENDATIONS ABOUT THE PROGRAM'S DESIGN AND EXPANSION STATEWIDE.
- 22 (D) ON OR BEFORE JULY 1, 2025, THE SECRETARY SHALL ISSUE GRANTS TO
 23 AT LEAST TWO PILOT SITES, LOCATED IN DIVERSE AREAS, THAT MEET THE
 24 DEPARTMENT'S COMMISSION'S REQUIREMENTS FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE

- 15 INSTITUTIONS WITH A 4-YEAR DEGREE NURSING PROGRAM, ONE OF WHOM SHALL
- 16 BE FROM A HISTORICALLY BLACK COLLEGE OR UNIVERSITY;
- 17 ONE REPRESENTATIVE FROM A PRIVATE HIGHER
- 18 EDUCATION INSTITUTION THAT PRIMARILY OFFERS 4-YEAR DEGREE PROGRAMS;
- 19 ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE MARYLAND NURSES
- 20 ASSOCIATION;
- 21 (8) (9) ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE MARYLAND ASSOCIATION

- 23 (9) (10) ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE MARYLAND INDEPENDENT
- 24 COLLEGE AND UNIVERSITY ASSOCIATION;

- 27 (11) (12) ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE LIFESPAN NETWORK;
- 28 (12) (13) ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE BALTIMORE COUNTY

- 1 (13) (14) ONE REPRESENTATIVE FROM A LABOR ORGANIZATION
- 2 THAT REPRESENTS CERTIFIED NURSING ASSISTANTS, LICENSED PRACTICAL
- 3 NURSES, AND REGISTERED NURSES;
- 4 (14) (15) ONE REPRESENTATIVE FROM A LOCAL WORKFORCE
- 5 INVESTMENT BOARD;
- 6 (15) (16) ONE PRACTICAL NURSING STUDENT IN THE STATE;
- 7 (16) (17) ONE LICENSED PRACTICAL NURSE LICENSED IN THE STATE;

- 9 <u>(17)</u> (18) ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF LEADINGAGE MARYLAND;

- 12 (17) (19) (20) ANY OTHER INDIVIDUAL WITH EXPERTISE OR
- 13 EXPERIENCE THAT THE SECRETARY DETERMINES IS RELEVANT TO THE

- 15 (D) THE SECRETARY SHALL DESIGNATE THE CHAIR OF THE COMMITTEE.
- 16 (E) THE DEPARTMENT COMMISSION SHALL PROVIDE STAFF FOR THE
- 17 COMMITTEE.
- 18 **(F)** A MEMBER OF THE COMMITTEE:
- 19 (1) MAY NOT RECEIVE COMPENSATION AS A MEMBER OF THE
- 20 **COMMITTEE**; BUT
- 21 (2) IS ENTITLED TO REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES UNDER THE
- 22 STANDARD STATE TRAVEL REGULATIONS, AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET.
