- 15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 16 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

22 (B) "COMMITTEE" MEANS THE MARYLAND PATHWAY TO NURSING 23 Advisory Committee.

1 (C) "PROGRAM" MEANS THE MARYLAND PATHWAY TO NURSING PILOT 2 PROGRAM.

4 (A) THERE IS A MARYLAND PATHWAY TO NURSING PILOT PROGRAM IN 5 THE DEPARTMENT.

6 (B) THE GOALS OF THE PROGRAM ARE TO:

7 (1) SUPPORT STUDENTS IN LICENSED PRACTICAL NURSING 8 EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS WHO INTEND TO PRACTICE LICENSED PRACTICAL 9 NURSING AS A CAREER IN THE STATE OR CONTINUE ON THE NURSING EDUCATIONAL 10 PATHWAY TO BECOME A REGISTERED NURSE IN THE STATE;

11 (2) ALLEVIATE THE SHORTAGE OF NURSING PROFESSIONALS BY 12 INCREASING THE GRADUATION AND LICENSURE RATES OF LICENSED PRACTICAL 13 NURSING AND REGISTERED NURSING STUDENTS IN THE STATE;

14(3) INCREASE THE NUMBER OF LICENSED PRACTICAL NURSES AND15REGISTERED NURSES WHO REFLECT THE DIVERSITY OF THE COMMUNITIES THEY16SERVE;

17(4) FACILITATE STUDENT APPLICATIONS FOR FINANCIAL18RESOURCES THAT PROVIDE TUITION ASSISTANCE, LOAN REPAYMENT, AND SUPPORT19FOR OTHER EDUCATIONAL COSTS; AND

20(5)PROVIDE PROGRAM PARTICIPANTS WITH FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE21TO COVER THE COST OF:

22 (I) COMPUTERS, TEXTBOOKS, AND OTHER SUPPLIES AND 23 ADDITIONAL EDUCATION SUPPORT SERVICES; AND

(II) WRAPAROUND SUPPORT SERVICES THAT PROVIDE
ASSISTANCE WITH TRANSPORTATION, CHILD CARE, ELDER CARE, AND OTHER
LIVING EXPENSES THAT POSE A BARRIER TO STUDENTS SUCCESSFULLY
COMPLETING THE STUDENT'S EDUCATIONAL REQUIREMENTS.

28 (C) THE SECRETARY, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE, 29 SHALL DETERMINE THE FOLLOWING FOR THE PROGRAM:

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- (1) THE TIME FRAME AND STEPS NECESSARY TO ESTABLISH THE

1 **PROGRAM;**

2 (2) THE AREAS OF THE STATE IN WHICH THE PROGRAM WILL 3 OPERATE;

4 (3) FUNDING TO SUPPORT THE PROGRAM, INCLUDING A STRATEGY 5 FOR SUSTAINABILITY THROUGH BRAIDED FUNDING FROM LOCAL WORKFORCE 6 DEVELOPMENT BOARDS, LOCAL HEALTH CARE SYSTEMS, AND FEDERAL GRANTS;

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(4) THE RESOURCES NECESSARY TO SUPPORT THE PROGRAM; AND

8 (5) THE TYPES OF EVALUATIONS, INCLUDING OBTAINING FEEDBACK 9 FROM STUDENTS AND EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS, NEEDED TO MAKE 10 RECOMMENDATIONS ABOUT THE PROGRAM'S DESIGN AND EXPANSION STATEWIDE.

11 (D) ON OR BEFORE JULY 1, 2025, THE SECRETARY SHALL ISSUE GRANTS TO 12 AT LEAST TWO PILOT SITES, LOCATED IN DIVERSE AREAS, THAT MEET THE 13 DEPARTMENT'S REQUIREMENTS FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE PROGRAM.

14 (E) ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 15, 2024, AND EACH DECEMBER 15 15 THEREAFTER THROUGH 2029, THE SECRETARY SHALL REPORT TO THE GOVERNOR 16 AND, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2–1257 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE 17 GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PROGRAM.

19 (A) THERE IS A MARYLAND PATHWAY TO NURSING ADVISORY COMMITTEE.

20 (B) THE COMMITTEE SHALL ASSIST THE SECRETARY IN THE DEVELOPMENT 21 AND IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PROGRAM.

22 (C) THE COMMITTEE CONSISTS OF THE FOLLOWING MEMBERS, APPOINTED 23 BY THE SECRETARY OF HEALTH:

24 (1) ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS 25 AFFAIRS;

26 (2) ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE MARYLAND HIGHER EDUCATION 27 COMMISSION;

28 (3) ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE STATE BOARD OF NURSING;

29 (4) FOUR REPRESENTATIVES FROM COMMUNITY COLLEGES IN THE 30 STATE THAT OFFER LICENSED PRACTICAL NURSING PROGRAMS;

TWO REPRESENTATIVES FROM PUBLIC HIGHER EDUCATION

 $\mathbf{2}$ INSTITUTIONS WITH A 4-YEAR DEGREE NURSING PROGRAM, ONE OF WHOM SHALL BE FROM A HISTORICALLY BLACK COLLEGE OR UNIVERSITY; 3 **ONE REPRESENTATIVE FROM A PRIVATE HIGHER EDUCATION** 4 (6) 5**INSTITUTION THAT PRIMARILY OFFERS 4-YEAR DEGREE PROGRAMS;** 6 (7) ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE MARYLAND NURSES 7 ASSOCIATION; 8 **ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE MARYLAND ASSOCIATION OF** (8) 9 **COMMUNITY COLLEGES:** 10 (9) ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE MARYLAND INDEPENDENT 11 **COLLEGE AND UNIVERSITY ASSOCIATION;** (10) **ONE** MARYLAND HOSPITAL 12REPRESENTATIVE OF THE **ASSOCIATION;** 13 14(11) ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE LIFESPAN NETWORK; (12) ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE BALTIMORE COUNTY PUBLIC 15**HEALTH PATHWAYS PROGRAM;** 16 (13) ONE REPRESENTATIVE FROM A LABOR ORGANIZATION THAT 17REPRESENTS CERTIFIED NURSING ASSISTANTS, LICENSED PRACTICAL NURSES, AND 18 19 **REGISTERED NURSES;** (14) ONE REPRESENTATIVE FROM A LOCAL WORKFORCE INVESTMENT 2021**BOARD;** 22(15) ONE PRACTICAL NURSING STUDENT IN THE STATE; (16) ONE LICENSED PRACTICAL NURSE LICENSED IN THE STATE; AND 2324(17) ANY OTHER INDIVIDUAL WITH EXPERTISE OR EXPERIENCE THAT 25THE SECRETARY DETERMINES IS RELEVANT TO THE COMMITTEE. THE SECRETARY SHALL DESIGNATE THE CHAIR OF THE COMMITTEE. 26**(**D**)**

27 (E) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PROVIDE STAFF FOR THE COMMITTEE.

1 (F) A MEMBER OF THE COMMITTEE:

2 (1) MAY NOT RECEIVE COMPENSATION AS A MEMBER OF THE 3 COMMITTEE; BUT

4 (2) IS ENTITLED TO REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES UNDER THE 5 STANDARD STATE TRAVEL REGULATIONS, AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET.

6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 7 1, 2024.
