1 AN ACT concerning

Correctional Services – Parole Supervision Fees and Drug and Alcohol Abuse Test Payment – Repeal

- FOR the purpose of repealing the requirement for the Maryland Parole Commission to assess a fee against an individual on parole and supervised by the Division of Parole and Probation under certain circumstances; repealing authorization for the Division of Parole and Probation to require a supervisee of the Division who is on parole to pay for certain drug or alcohol abuse testing under certain circumstances; and generally relating to parole supervision fees and drug and alcohol abuse test payment.

- In this section, "supervisee" means an individual supervised by the Division 1 2 of Parole and Probation for the Commission. 3 (b) Unless a supervisee is exempted by the Commission under subsection (d) of this section, the Commission shall assess a monthly fee of \$50 as a condition of supervision 4 5 for each supervisee. 6 The fee assessed under subsection (b) of this section shall be paid to the 7 Division of Parole and Probation. 8 The Division of Parole and Probation shall pay all money collected 9 under this section into the General Fund of the State. 10 (d) The Commission may exempt a supervisee wholly or partly from the fee assessed under subsection (b) of this section if: 11 12 (1)the supervisee has diligently attempted but has been unable to obtain 13 employment that provides sufficient income for the supervisee to pay the fee; 14 (2)the supervisee is a student in a school, college, or university or is enrolled in a course of vocational or technical training designed to prepare the supervisee 15 for gainful employment; and 16 17 the institution in which the supervisee is enrolled supplies 18 certification of student status to the Commission; 19 the supervisee has a disability that limits possible employment, as (3)20 determined by a physical or psychological examination that the Commission accepts or 21orders; 22 **(4)** the supervisee is responsible for the support of dependents and the 23 payment of the fee constitutes an undue hardship on the supervisee; or 24(5)other extenuating circumstances exist. 25(e) The fee assessed under subsection (b) of this section is in addition to court costs and fines. 26 27 (f) If a supervisee does not comply with the fee requirement: (1) 28 (i) the Division of Parole and Probation shall notify the Commission; 29and 30 (ii) the Commission may revoke parole or mandatory supervision.
