1 AN ACT concerning

2 Education – Maryland Civic Excellence Program – Established

- FOR the purpose of establishing the Maryland Civic Excellence Program as a voluntary
 program in which local school systems may participate to recognize students and
 public schools that promote the civic readiness and civic engagement of students in
 public schools in the State; and generally relating to the establishment of the
 Maryland Civic Excellence Program.

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 15 Article Education
- 16 **4–142.**

17 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "PROGRAM" MEANS THE MARYLAND CIVIC 18 EXCELLENCE PROGRAM ESTABLISHED UNDER THIS SECTION.

19 (B) (1) THERE IS A MARYLAND CIVIC EXCELLENCE PROGRAM.

20 (2) THE PURPOSE OF THE PROGRAM IS TO RECOGNIZE STUDENTS 21 AND PUBLIC SCHOOLS THAT PROMOTE THE CIVIC READINESS AND CIVIC 22 ENGAGEMENT OF STUDENTS IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS IN THE STATE.



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1 (C) THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION APPLY ONLY TO A LOCAL SCHOOL 2 SYSTEM THAT CHOOSES TO PARTICIPATE IN AND ADMINISTER THE PROGRAM.

3 (D) BEGINNING WITH THE 2025–2026 SCHOOL YEAR, EACH PARTICIPATING 4 LOCAL SCHOOL SYSTEM SHALL:

5 (1) AWARD A STUDENT A SEAL OF CIVIC EXCELLENCE IF THE 6 STUDENT APPLIES AND MEETS THE CRITERIA ESTABLISHED BY THE LOCAL SCHOOL 7 SYSTEM UNDER SUBSECTION (E) OF THIS SECTION; AND

8 (2) DESIGNATE A PUBLIC SCHOOL AS A CENTER OF CIVIC 9 EXCELLENCE IF THE SCHOOL APPLIES AND MEETS THE CRITERIA ADOPTED BY THE 10 LOCAL SCHOOL SYSTEM UNDER SUBSECTION (G) OF THIS SECTION.

11 (E) AT MINIMUM, A PARTICIPATING LOCAL SCHOOL SYSTEM'S CRITERIA 12 FOR A SEAL OF CIVIC EXCELLENCE SHALL REQUIRE A STUDENT TO:

13(1)(I)Take the Maryland Comprehensive Assessment for14GOVERNMENT; AND

15(II) MEET THE ASSESSMENT REQUIREMENTS FOR16 GRADUATION;

17 (2) EARN A GRADE OF A OR B IN EACH OF THE FOLLOWING HIGH 18 SCHOOL SOCIAL STUDIES COURSES:

- 19 (I) UNITED STATES HISTORY;
- 20 (II) MODERN WORLD HISTORY; AND
- 21 (III) AMERICAN GOVERNMENT; AND

22 (3) COMPLETE AND DEMONSTRATE EVIDENCE OF AT LEAST 75 HOURS 23 OF STUDENT SERVICE, OF WHICH AT LEAST 30 HOURS SHALL BE DEDICATED TO A 24 SERVICE LEARNING PROJECT WITH A FOCUS ON COMMUNITY AND CIVIC 25 ENGAGEMENT.

26 (F) A PARTICIPATING LOCAL SCHOOL SYSTEM SHALL ESTABLISH 27 APPLICATION CRITERIA TO ADMINISTER THE PROGRAM.

(G) AT MINIMUM, A PARTICIPATING LOCAL SCHOOL SYSTEM'S CRITERIA
FOR A CENTER OF CIVIC EXCELLENCE DESIGNATION SHALL REQUIRE A PUBLIC
SCHOOL TO HAVE AT LEAST 50% OF THE STUDENTS IN ITS GRADUATING CLASS WHO
HAVE EARNED A SEAL OF CIVIC EXCELLENCE.

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(1) 1 **(H)** A LOCAL SCHOOL SYSTEM THAT DETERMINES A STUDENT HAS $\mathbf{2}$ FULFILLED THE CRITERIA UNDER THE PROGRAM SHALL: 3 **(I)** AWARD THE STUDENT A SEAL OF CIVIC EXCELLENCE; **RECORD THE AWARD ON THE STUDENT'S OFFICIAL HIGH** 4 **(II)** $\mathbf{5}$ SCHOOL TRANSCRIPT; AND (III) **RECOGNIZE THE AWARD BY ATTACHING A CORD, MEDAL, OR** 6 7 OTHER INSIGNIA ON THE STUDENT'S HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA. 8 (2) A LOCAL SCHOOL SYSTEM THAT DETERMINES THAT A PUBLIC 9 SCHOOL HAS FULFILLED THE CRITERIA UNDER THE PROGRAM SHALL: 10 **(I)** DESIGNATE THE SCHOOL AS A CENTER OF CIVIC **EXCELLENCE; AND** 11 12**(II) RECOGNIZE THE DESIGNATION BY PROVIDING ANY OF THE** 13**FOLLOWING:** 141. A BANNER; 2. 15A GOVERNOR'S CITATION; OR 16 3. A CITATION FROM THE DEPARTMENT. 17**(I)** ON OR BEFORE JULY 1, 2026, AND EACH JULY 1 THEREAFTER, EACH PARTICIPATING LOCAL SCHOOL SYSTEM SHALL SUBMIT TO THE DEPARTMENT A 18 19 REPORT ON THE PROGRAM BASED ON THE MOST RECENTLY COMPLETED SCHOOL 20YEAR. 21SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 221, 2024.
