- 28 (III) SELECT AN APPROPRIATE SERVICE ANIMAL FOR EACH
- 29 **PROGRAM PARTICIPANT**;

- 1 (IV) FACILITATE EACH PROGRAM PARTICIPANT'S TRAINING 2 USING THE NONPROFIT TRAINING ENTITY'S TRAINING PROTOCOL; AND

- 4 THE SERVICE ANIMAL ON THE PROGRAM PARTICIPANT'S SUCCESSFUL COMPLETION

- 7 (A) TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR SELECTION AS A NONPROFIT TRAINING ENTITY
- 8 UNDER § 7–1104 OF THIS SUBTITLE, A NONPROFIT TRAINING ENTITY SHALL:
- 9 (1) SERVE THE NEEDS OF ELIGIBLE INDIVIDUALS IN THE STATE; AND
- 10 (2) GENERATE ITS OWN REVENUE AND REINVEST THE PROCEEDS OF
- 11 THAT REVENUE IN THE GROWTH AND DEVELOPMENT OF ITS PROGRAMS.
- 12 (B) A NONPROFIT TRAINING ENTITY MAY DISQUALIFY A PROGRAM
- 13 PARTICIPANT FROM PARTICIPATION IN THE PROGRAM IF THE NONPROFIT
- 14 TRAINING ENTITY DETERMINES THAT THE PROGRAM PARTICIPANT'S INVOLVEMENT
- 15 IN THE PROGRAM:
- 16 (1) PRESENTS A DANGER TO THE PROGRAM PARTICIPANT'S MENTAL
- 17 OR PHYSICAL WELL-BEING;
- 18 (2) HAS CAUSED OR MAY POTENTIALLY CAUSE HARM TO OTHERS, AN
- 19 ANIMAL, OR PROPERTY; PRESENTS A DIRECT THREAT TO OTHERS, AS DEFINED BY
- 20 THE FEDERAL AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT:
- 21 (3) PRESENTS A <del>DANGER</del> DIRECT THREAT TO THE SERVICE ANIMAL'S
- 22 MENTAL OR PHYSICAL WELL-BEING; OR
- 23 (4) DOES NOT MEET THE TRAINING REQUIREMENTS OF THE
- 24 NONPROFIT.
- 25 (C) A PROGRAM PARTICIPANT MAY DISCONTINUE INVOLVEMENT IN THE
- 26 Program for any reason.
- 27 **7–1106.**
- 28 (A) THERE IS A MARYLAND DISABILITY ANIMAL SERVICE FUND.
- 29 (B) THE PURPOSE OF THE FUND IS TO:

1	(1) PAY A NONPROFIT TRAINING ENTITY; AND
2	(2) COVER THE COSTS OF ADMINISTERING THE PROGRAM.
3	(C) THE SECRETARY SHALL ADMINISTER THE FUND.
4 5	(D) (1) THE FUND IS A SPECIAL, NONLAPSING FUND THAT IS NOT SUBJECT TO § 7–302 OF THE STATE FINANCE AND PROCUREMENT ARTICLE.
6 7	(2) THE STATE TREASURER SHALL HOLD THE FUND, AND THE COMPTROLLER SHALL ACCOUNT FOR THE FUND.
8	(E) (1) THE FUND CONSISTS OF:
9	(I) REVENUE COLLECTED BY THE DEPARTMENT IN THE FORM OF DONATIONS TO THE PROGRAM;
11	(II) MONEY APPROPRIATED IN THE STATE BUDGET TO THE FUND; AND
13 14	(III) ANY OTHER MONEY FROM ANY OTHER SOURCE ACCEPTED FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE FUND.
15 16	(2) EXPENDITURES FROM THE FUND MAY BE MADE ONLY IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE STATE BUDGET.
17 18 19	(3) MONEY EXPENDED FROM THE FUND IS SUPPLEMENTAL TO AND IS NOT INTENDED TO TAKE THE PLACE OF FUNDING THAT OTHERWISE WOULD BE APPROPRIATED FOR THE PROGRAM.
20	(F) THE FUND MAY BE USED ONLY TO PAY:
21	(1) A NONPROFIT TRAINING ENTITY; AND
22	(2) ADMINISTRATIVE COSTS OF THE PROGRAM.
23 24 25	(G) (1) THE STATE TREASURER SHALL INVEST AND REINVEST THE MONEY OF THE FUND IN THE SAME MANNER AS OTHER STATE MONEY MAY BE INVESTED.

28 (H) FOR THE PURPOSE OF IMPLEMENTING THIS SECTION, THE 29 DEPARTMENT MAY ACCEPT GIFTS OR GRANTS FOR DONATION TO THE FUND.
