2 Northwest Baltimore County Sports Tourism Facility – Feasibility Study

FOR the purpose of requiring the Maryland Stadium Authority to conduct a certain
feasibility study for developing, establishing, and operating a certain sports tourism
facility in northwest Baltimore County; and generally relating to a feasibility study
for a sports tourism facility in northwest Baltimore County.

7 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,8 That:

9 (a) The Maryland Stadium Authority shall study and make recommendations on 10 the feasibility of establishing and operating a sports tourism facility at Reisterstown 11 Regional Park in northwest Baltimore County.

12 (b) In conducting the study required under subsection (a) of this section, the 13 Maryland Stadium Authority shall:

14 (1) identify available and potential federal, State, and local funding sources15 for the project;

16 (2) identify the infrastructure needs, capital costs, and operating costs 17 associated with:

18 (i) construction of the land located at 401 Mitchell Drive,
19 Reisterstown, MD 21136;

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2024. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and 1 month <u>7 months</u> and, at the end of July 31, 2025 <u>January 31, 2026</u>, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
