A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Hospitals - Care of Infants After Discharge

3 FOR the purpose of requiring a hospital to take certain actions relating to the care of infants 4 before the hospital discharges an infant, including providing oral and written $\mathbf{5}$ instructions to the parent or legal guardian on how to provide a safe sleep 6 environment and providing a list of resources available for an infant's parent or legal 7 guardian; requiring the Maryland Department of Health, in consultation with local 8 health officers, to develop a certain list of resources available for an infant's parent 9 or legal guardian; and generally relating to the care of infants after discharge from a hospital. 10

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

4 (D) THE DEPARTMENT, IN CONSULTATION WITH LOCAL HEALTH OFFICERS, 5 SHALL MAINTAIN A LIST OF RESOURCES AVAILABLE TO PARENTS AND LEGAL 6 GUARDIANS IN THE APPLICABLE GEOGRAPHIC AREA OF EACH HOSPITAL TO OBTAIN 7 THE ITEMS NECESSARY TO PROVIDE A SAFE SLEEP ENVIRONMENT FOR AN INFANT.

8 SECTION 2 AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 9 October 1, 2024.
