A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Washington County – Alcoholic Beverages – Multi–Use Sports and Events**
3 **Facility Beer, Wine, and Liquor License**

4 FOR the purpose of altering the stadium beer and wine license in Washington County to
5 be a multi–use sports and events facility beer, wine, and liquor license; authorizing
6 the license holder to sell beer, wine, and liquor for on–premises consumption in the
7 multi–use sports and events facility; and generally relating to alcoholic beverages in
8 Washington County.

19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
20 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

21 **Article – Alcoholic Beverages and Cannabis**

22 31–102.

23 This title applies only in Washington County.

24 31–1005.

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS INDICATE MATTER ADDED TO EXISTING LAW.

[Brackets] indicate matter deleted from existing law.



1 (a) In this section, “premises” includes the entire [stadium] **MULTI-USE SPORTS**
2 **AND EVENTS** facility [and the stadium parking lots].

3 (b) There is a [stadium] **MULTI-USE SPORTS AND EVENTS FACILITY** beer,
4 **WINE**, and [wine] **LIQUOR** license.

5 (c) The Board may issue the license to the owner of a professional baseball team
6 franchise that may be in any form of business organization, including partnership,
7 corporation, and limited liability company **THAT WILL OPERATE AS A MULTI-USE**
8 **SPORTS AND EVENTS FACILITY**.

9 (d) [(1)] The license authorizes the license holder to sell beer, **WINE**, and [wine]
10 **LIQUOR**[:

11 (i)] for on-premises consumption to individuals present at an event
12 held in the [stadium] **MULTI-USE SPORTS AND EVENTS FACILITY**[: and

13 (ii) in plastic, Styrofoam, or paper containers.

14 (2) The written approval of the Board is required before beer and wine may
15 be sold, served, or consumed:

16 (i) on a parking lot of the stadium; or

17 (ii) during an event other than a baseball game in which the team of
18 the license holder is playing].

19 (e) The license holder [may sell beer and wine from the time the stadium opens
20 for the event until the event ends] **SHALL REQUIRE ALL EMPLOYEES TO:**

21 **(1) COMPLETE AN ALCOHOL AWARENESS TRAINING PROGRAM; AND**

22 **(2) OBTAIN A CROWD CONTROL TRAINING CERTIFICATE.**

23 (f) The license holder may not allow an individual to carry alcoholic beverages
24 onto or from the licensed premises.

25 (g) [(1)] The annual license fee is [\$2,000] **\$2,500**.

26 [(2)] The fee for a Sunday permit is \$250.]

27 **SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED**, That this Act shall take effect July
28 1, 2024.
