September 1, 2022, the Department shall award at least three grants, each of which does

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- 1 (e) (1) Subject to paragraph (2) of this subsection, for **[each of]** fiscal years 2023, **[and]** 2024, **AND** 2026, AND EACH FISCAL YEAR THEREAFTER, the Governor shall include in the annual budget bill an appropriation of \$450,000 to the Program.
- 4 (2) To the extent authorized under federal law, the Governor shall use 5 federal funds to satisfy the requirement of paragraph (1) of this subsection.
- 6 (f) The Department shall develop guidelines, in consultation with the Maryland 7 Child Care Resource Center, for the grant application process and grant recipients.
- 8 (g) (1) The Department may seek funding to start the Program.
- 9 (2) If the Department receives funding before July 1, 2022, the Department shall begin awarding grants as soon as possible under the Program.
- 11 (h) Each year, the Department shall develop and publish goals for the Program.
- 12 (i) On or before December 1, 2021, and each December 1 thereafter, the 13 Department shall report to the General Assembly, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the State 14 Government Article, on the status of the Program and an evaluation of local [pilot] 15 programs in meeting the Program goals.
