## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Civil Actions – Enforcement Actions by the Attorney General – Statutes of**  
3 **Limitations**

4 FOR the purpose of repealing certain statutes of limitations for certain civil enforcement  
5 actions brought by the Attorney General; and generally relating to statutes of  
6 limitations.

17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,  
18 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

19 **Article – Courts and Judicial Proceedings**

20 5–107.

21 Except **FOR A CIVIL ENFORCEMENT ACTION BROUGHT BY THE ATTORNEY**  
22 **GENERAL OR** as provided in § 5–106 of this subtitle, § 1–303 of the Environment Article,

1 and § 8–1815 of the Natural Resources Article, a prosecution or suit for a fine, penalty, or  
2 forfeiture shall be instituted within one year after the offense was committed.

5 (d) (1) **(I) [An] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF THIS**  
6 **PARAGRAPH, AN** action brought to enforce this subtitle shall be commenced within 4 years  
7 after the cause of action accrues.

8 **(II) THE ATTORNEY GENERAL MAY COMMENCE A CIVIL**  
9 **ENFORCEMENT ACTION TO ENFORCE THIS SUBTITLE AT ANY TIME.**

10 (2) For the purposes of this subsection, a cause of action for a continuing  
11 violation accrues at the time of the latest violation.

12 (3) Whenever the State commences a criminal proceeding under this  
13 subtitle or the United States commences a criminal antitrust proceeding under the federal  
14 antitrust laws, any civil action under this section related to the subject matter of the  
15 criminal proceeding shall be commenced within 1 year after the conclusion of the  
16 proceeding or within 4 years after the cause of action accrued, whichever is later.

17 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
18 October 1, 2024.
