1 AN ACT concerning

Nonprescription Drugs and Devices – Provision by Registered Nurses and Sale of Contraceptives Through Automatic Devices

FOR the purpose of repealing the prohibition on the sale of certain contraceptives by means
of a vending machine or other automatic device repealing a prohibition against the
sale of nonlatex condoms through a vending machine or other automatic device;
prohibiting the sale of natural membrane condoms through a vending machine or
other automatic device; authorizing registered nurses to provide, without a
prescription, nonprescription drugs and devices in a local health department under
certain circumstances; and generally relating to nonprescription drugs and devices.
