1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Higher Education – Part–Time Senatorial and Delegate Scholarships –**
3 **Alterations**

4 FOR the purpose of allowing an applicant of a part–time senatorial or delegate scholarship
5 with a documented disability to request from the Maryland Higher Education
6 Commission a waiver from the requirement to carry a certain number of semester
7 hours each semester; and generally relating to part–time senatorial and delegate
8 scholarships.

19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
20 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article – Education

2 18–401.

3 There is a program of senatorial scholarships in this State that are awarded under
4 this subtitle.

5 18–406.

6 (a) Except as otherwise provided in this section, each recipient of a senatorial
7 scholarship may hold the scholarship for 4 undergraduate academic years, subject to §
8 18–406.1 of this subtitle, and 4 graduate academic years if the recipient:

9 (1) Is a full–time student;

10 (2) Continues to be eligible for in–State tuition under this article; and

11 (3) Continues to be a student at the institution and takes at least 12
12 semester hours of courses as an undergraduate or 9 semester hours of courses as a graduate
13 student each semester leading to a degree.14 (b) A recipient of an undergraduate or graduate senatorial scholarship may hold
15 the scholarship, appropriately prorated, for 8 academic years if the recipient:

16 (1) Is a part–time student;

17 (2) Continues to be eligible for in–State tuition under this article; and

18 (3) Continues to be a student at the institution and takes at least 6
19 semester hours of courses each semester leading to a degree.20 (c) Any recipient of a senatorial scholarship may use up to one–half of the yearly
21 award for summer school.22 (d) A recipient of a senatorial scholarship who is enrolled in a terminal certificate
23 program as provided in § 18–402(a)(1) of this subtitle may hold the scholarship for 2 years
24 if the recipient is a full–time student and otherwise meets the conditions of subsection (a)
25 of this section, or may hold the scholarship for 4 years if the recipient is a part–time student
26 and otherwise meets the conditions of subsection (b) of this section.27 (e) A recipient of a senatorial scholarship who is currently enrolled, or was
28 enrolled within the last 2 years, in a certificate or license program, course, or sequence of
29 courses at a community college that leads to certification or licensure, as provided in §
30 18–402(a)(3) of this subtitle, may use the scholarship to reimburse educational expenses as
31 defined by the Office under § 18–405(b)(2) of this subtitle.

1 (f) Each recipient of a senatorial scholarship who is enrolled in a private
2 postsecondary proprietary institution that is accredited by a national accrediting
3 association approved by the United States Department of Education:

4 (1) May hold the scholarship for the completion of one program if the
5 student otherwise meets the conditions of subsection (a)(1) and (2) of this section; and

6 (2) Shall complete the program within the length of time prescribed by the
7 institution for the completion of the program.

8 (g) A recipient of a senatorial scholarship who is an individual who is on active
9 duty with the United States military and otherwise meets the conditions of subsection (a)
10 or (b) of this section may be domiciled in this State rather than eligible for in-State tuition
11 under this article.

12 **(H) ON REQUEST FROM AN APPLICANT OF THE SCHOLARSHIP WITH A**
13 **DOCUMENTED DISABILITY, THE MARYLAND HIGHER EDUCATION COMMISSION MAY**
14 **WAIVE THE REQUIREMENT IN SUBSECTION (B)(3) OF THIS SECTION.**

16 (a) There is a program of Delegate Scholarships in this State that are awarded
17 under this subtitle.

18 18-504.

19 (a) A Delegate may award two part-time scholarships for each full-time
20 scholarship available.

21 (b) A part-time scholarship may not be for more than twice as many years as a
22 full-time scholarship.

23 (c) Each recipient of a part-time scholarship shall carry at least 6 semester hours
24 of courses each semester in a program leading to a degree.

25 **(D) ON REQUEST FROM AN APPLICANT OF THE SCHOLARSHIP WITH A**
26 **DOCUMENTED DISABILITY, THE MARYLAND HIGHER EDUCATION COMMISSION MAY**
27 **WAIVE THE REQUIREMENT IN SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION.**

28 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
29 1, 2024.
