- The holder of a Class A OR CLASS D license or an employee of the 1 (1) (a) 2 license holder may deliver alcoholic beverages only within the county. 3 An employee making a delivery shall meet the age requirements of § 23–1902 of this subtitle. 4 The deliverer and individual receiving the delivery shall, at the time of 5 (b) 6 delivery, endorse a delivery form that the Board approves, certifying that: 7 (1)the individual receiving the delivery claimed to be at least 21 years old and the claim was supported by documentary evidence; 8 9 (2)the individual receiving the delivery knew that it is a criminal offense 10 for alcoholic beverages to be given to an individual under the age of 21 years; and 11 (3) the deliverer examined the recipient's identification. A license holder or an employee of a license holder may not make a retail 12 13 delivery of alcoholic beverages unless the purchaser: 14 or another individual at least 21 years old designated by the purchaser, (1)15 is physically present to receive the alcoholic beverages at the time and place of delivery; 16 and 17 **(2)** pays for the purchase at the time of the order.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 18
