A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

State Lottery – Instant Ticket Lottery Machines – Veterans' and Fraternal Organizations

4 FOR the purpose of authorizing the Director of the State Lottery and Gaming Control $\mathbf{5}$ Agency to issue certain fraternal organizations a license for not more than a certain 6 number of instant ticket lottery machines; altering the distribution of proceeds from 7 certain instant ticket lottery machine sales by veterans' organizations; providing for 8 the distribution of proceeds from certain instant ticket lottery machine sales by 9 fraternal organizations; authorizing, instead of requiring, the Director to consider certain information before issuing certain licenses; repealing a requirement that 10 11 certain veterans' organizations purchase or lease certain instant ticket lottery 12machines; and generally relating to the operation of instant ticket lottery machines in the State. 13

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

7 (ii)] An organization may not use receipts from the sale of tickets 8 from instant ticket lottery machines that would otherwise be [credited to the State Lottery 9 Fund] **DISTRIBUTED AS REQUIRED UNDER PARAGRAPH (3) OF THIS SUBSECTION** for 10 the costs of purchasing or leasing instant ticket lottery machines.

11 (5) The Director may adopt regulations to implement the provisions of this 12 subsection that include restricting the location of instant ticket lottery machines in areas 13 of a veterans' organization's **OR A FRATERNAL ORGANIZATION'S** public meeting hall that 14 is accessible to the public.

15 (6) The Agency shall ensure that the element of chance in the conduct of 16 the gaming through the instant ticket lottery machines established under this subsection 17 is consistent with the holding in the case of Chesapeake Amusements Inc. v. Riddle, 363 18 Md. 16 (2001), in that the element of chance must be wholly within the pre-printed instant 19 lottery ticket, and that player enhancements in an instant ticket lottery machine may not 20 affect the element of chance being wholly within the pre-printed instant lottery ticket.

21 (e) The Director may not issue a license to:

(1) a person or governmental unit to engage in business primarily as a
licensed agent; or

- 24 (2) an individual who is under the age of 21 years.
- 25 (f) The Commission may hear and decide an appeal of a denial of a license.

26 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 27 1, 2024.
