- FOR the purpose of increasing certain authorizing increases to certain annual 4 appropriations for certain school safety expenditures beginning in certain fiscal 5 6 years; altering the allocation of certain funds to be based on student enrollment; 7 authorizing local school systems to use certain funds for school security employees; requiring the Maryland Center for School Safety, the State Department of 8 9 Education, the Maryland Coordination and Analysis Center, and the Interagency 10 Commission on School Construction jointly to review and provide guidance on the 11 state of physical security in schools; and generally relating to appropriations for school safety expenditures and school security employees. 12
