Community Colleges – Maryland Community College Promise Scholarship –
 Requirements

- FOR the purpose of establishing that applicants for a Maryland Community College
  Promise Scholarship are not subject to certain requirements of the scholarship
  application process if the applicant enrolls in or participates in certain programs or
  courses; authorizing a community college to require certain applicants for a
  Maryland Community College Promise Scholarship to complete an application for
  admission to the community college; and generally relating to Maryland Community
  College Promise Scholarships.

- 1 (a) (1) (i) Subject to subparagraph (ii) of this paragraph, a student may apply annually to a Maryland community college located in the county or, in the case of a regional community college, in the region where the applicant lives to receive a Maryland Community College Promise Scholarship award.
  - (ii) If the community college located in the county or region where the applicant lives does not offer the degree or certification program in which the applicant wants to enroll, the student may apply to the community college outside the county or, in the case of a regional community college, outside the region where the applicant lives to receive a Maryland Community College Promise Scholarship award.
- 10 (2) A community college annually shall select eligible applicants and offer 11 a Maryland Community College Promise Scholarship award to each selected applicant to 12 be used for tuition at the community college.
- 13 (b) An applicant is eligible for a Maryland Community College Promise 14 Scholarship award if the applicant:
