<b>10. Description and Purpose of Organization</b> (Limit length to visible area)							

The Mid-Atlantic Off-Road Enthusiasts (MORE) is the premier trail-building advocacy and mountain biking club in Maryland, DC, and Northern Virginia. MORE's mission is to increase access to natural-surface trails throughout the region for all trail users and build an inclusive mountain biking community. Founded in 1992, MORE advocates for sustainable, natural-surface trails throughout the region and has built an impressive network of multi-use trails and a strong community of trail users. MORE helps maintain over 900 miles of natural-surface trails in over 60 state, county and city parks, through the work of thousands of MORE volunteers and over 15,000 volunteer hours annually. MORE also hosts ride events and group rides for kids and adults. MORE is a volunteer run organization with ~2000 members and one employee.

## **11. Description and Purpose of Project** (Limit length to visible area)

This grant would allow MORE, in partnership with the City of Annapolis, to enhance the Waterworks Park trail system, north of Annapolis. This 12-mile trail system was built over the last four years by MORE volunteers and is very popular with hikers and cyclists. This project would address two unmet needs at the park: parking and additional bike-specific trails. Currently, parking is only available at the park's south end, making full trail access challenging due to the 6-mile length. This grant would fund a 5000 sq ft gravel parking lot for about 15 cars adjacent to the northern trailhead off Honeysuckle Lane, facilitating better access to the northern portions of the park, especially for hikers. This grant would also fund additional mountain bike-specific downhill trails and a return climbing trail, totaling about mile. These trails would satisfy a significant demand within the cycling community and be conveniently located near the new parking area.

## 28. Comments

MORE has worked closely with the City of Annapolis since 2018 to design, construct, and maintain over 14 miles of natural surface trails at Waterworks Park. Today, this trail network is the closest natural surface trail system to the City of Annapolis and Crownsville and has become an essential recreational resource for our residents and the surrounding area.

The City of Annapolis owns the property where the improvements will be made. MORE will build the improvements using a third party professional contractor with access granted by the City of Annapolis. MORE has walked the proposed project area with the City of Annapolis Department of Public Works, which has approved the project subject to LBI funding.

MORE has previously contracted for trail building numerous times with both local and regional trail builders. Our most recent bids and contracts were executed earlier in 2023, giving us confidence in our estimates. MORE has also recently contracted for a gravel parking lot refurbishment and has obtained recent verbal estimates of the cost of a new gravel parking lot. The total project cost is shown below:

New 5000 sq. ft. gravel parking lot: \$55,000 One gravity natural surface trail (1500 feet @ \$10/ft): \$15,000 Return trail (2000 feet @ \$6/ft): \$12,000 Contingency: \$3,000 Total Estimated Cost: \$85,000

In addition, MORE could support a contingency fund of up to \$10,000 by adding \$7,000 out of organizational funds.

The Annapolis region has approximately 35 miles of multi-use single track built almost exclusively by volunteers, but limited bike specific facilities constructed by professional contractors. The project will enhance the equity and inclusion of the mountain biker user group by creating a facility focused on mountain biking in a region with few bike-specific facilities. The trail will be designed for all skill levels, allowing beginners to build skills in a safe and controlled environment. The trails in Waterworks Park are accessible by the public free-of-charge, increasing availability to users of all income levels.
