28. Comments

This support is needed to overcome the effects of the pandemic including the loss of almost all of our income for over 2 years. We are still trying to return to operating at pre pandemic levels, however, people are only gradually returning to being in social settings at levels that preceded the pandemic.

In addition to allowing us to continue our partnership with Prince Georges County schools in supporting special needs citizens, we will also be able to continue working in partnership with the Fedeeral Government, specifically HUD to provide assistance to homeless Veterans. HUD provides new homes while ELKS Lodges assist with outfitting those new homes in Prince Georges County and elsewhere.

These grant funds are helping us to ensure that we have a more modern and updated facility that operates within updated/unanticipated changes to county regulations that are costly. This support has also aided us in significantly reducing operating costs which in turn helps to ensure that we can continue providing these services well into the future.

The grant funding will increase our square footage by 5000 square feet as a result of constructing a new outdoor pavillion. Some of the funding will not increase square footage but will be used for renovation of existing facilities.
