28. Comments

The Lakeside pavilion has been a work in progress for the last 5 years. The design was completed and funded by private donations directly to CBEC. Construction on the Lakeside Educational Pavilion has started but due to rapidly increasing construction costs the project had to be phased based on available funding. CBEC has funded over \$350,000 in improvements for the Pavilion thus far and continues fundraising. The Queen Anne's County Commissioners are making a significant contribution to assist with the project by extending public sewer to the site and providing a construction grant. The requested 250,000 would provide adequate funding to complete construction of the pavilion this year.

Currently approximately 32,000 people visit the site to enjoy nature, wildlife, and take advantage of the educational and recreational opportunities. Currently 4,000 - 6,000 school students visit the site for "hands on" and "in the field" Environmental Education. With the addition of the pavilion the number of students is anticipated to increase to 10,000 per year provided the budget will support and additional environmental educator.
