Founded in 1976 as the Northwest Senior Center, The Edward A. Myerberg Senior Center is the largest privately-run and operated community center for older adults in Baltimore City. After running out of space at its storefront location on Reisterstown Road, The Center moved to its current location on the corner of Clarks Lane and Fallstaff Road in 1989. The Myerberg Center's mission is to inspire healthy aging through wellness, creativity and connection in the areas of health, fitness, social engagement, humanities, creative arts and technology. In 2020, our Virtual Center was founded and continues to offer over 30 virtual programs weekly in addition to over 30 onsite programs as well as hybrid programs. Members can take virtual programs from anywhere in the world and access recording through a On-Demand Library.

The Edward A. Myerberg Senior Center premises consist of one 20,660 sq. ft. building. Facilities are critical to provide services to older adults in a modern, state of the art environment. The purpose of this project is to enable the Edward A. Myerberg Senior Center to improve facilities including a new roof, heating, ventilation and air-conditioning systems throughout the building, audio-visual equipment, siding replacement, window repair/replacement, and other building systems.
