10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)

Graham Equestrian Center's (GEC) mission is to educate the mind, improve the body and lift the spirits of local children and adults, regardless of income or (dis)ability through the joy of horses. GEC is a 501c3 non-profit equine educational facility located 2 miles north of the Baltimore Beltway. GEC offers convenient access to a tranquil equine environment for residents of Baltimore City and Baltimore County. We are a Maryland Horse Industry Board, Horse Discovery Center and we welcome the public for our educational events. Our outreach programs, large lesson program, Horse Discovery Days and open house events expand the awareness and benefits of equine interaction into our community and provide equine therapy to those with disorders or trauma. The horse/human connection is at the heart of our work. *See Section 28 for outreach programs and organizations we serve.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

We are proposing the construction of an enclosed arena to supplement our outdoor arena at Graham Equestrian Center, located in Baltimore County within Gunpowder Falls State Park where the State of Maryland Department of Natural Resources is vested with jurisdiction. Preliminary approval has been granted for the proposed arena by the Maryland Park Service. Such a building will enhance our ability to serve the community, providing horse education and equine therapy and other experiences to the general public. Inclement weather events currently negatively impact our 7-day per week operations, causing severe loss of revenue (avg. of 68 days/year lost), especially during the winter months. This arena would eliminate the detrimental effects of these weather events on our operations by decreasing the number of cancellations. It will also enable GEC to offer a greater number and range of educational programs as well as safely offer additional therapeutic equine activities.

Section 12 note:

CONSTRUCTION - Estimated cost of construction increased since 2021 bond initiative due to inflation of construction materials, slightly larger square footage in design drawings, and additional of handicapped-accessible restroom and electricity/lighting.

EQUIPMENT - GEC currently owns equipment used to maintain the facility. GEC may also need additional equipment related to the enclosed arena. The equipment value noted in Section 12 is an estimated value to replace existing equipment if needed and also includes the estimated cost of a riding ring watering system (Arena Drag). Some of the equipment currently in use include a tractor with front end loader, harrow, auger, and a riding mower.

Section 13 and 14 notes:

GEC will approach the project in Phases:

PHASE 1 - Design and Site improvements (site survey & engineering, tree removal, demo of existing fences and run-in shed, build new run-in shed, install new fences and other improvements needed in the immediate area of the proposed enclosed arena)

PHASE 2 - Construction (purchase materials, construction, additional site improvements, grading and excavation)

PHASE 3 - Footing for horses, construction of handicapped-accessible restroom, electricity and lighting

Section 18 note:

Funds to build 5 Storm Water Management bioretention ponds supplemented 83% through grants administered by the Maryland Department of Natural Resources with funding from the Chesapeake Bay Trust, Chesapeake and Atlantic Coastal Bays Trust Fund, Baltimore County Department of Environmental Protection and Sustainability, and the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation.
