11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

Howard County Government wishes to repurpose the former Circuit Courthouse, a landmark 1842 building in Ellicott City, Maryland, into a vibrant Center for Arts, Culture and History. The building was vacated in 2020 with the construction of a new circuit courthouse, and existing facility will be renovated to accommodate the new tenants, who include the Howard County Center for the Arts, Asian American Cultural Center (AAPI), Roving Radish farm to table food program, and a shared commercial kitchen. This project will include a comprehensive renovation of the existing structure, reconfiguring spaces to address the planed program elements, as well as replacing systems that are beyond their service life. The project will include renovations to improve ADA accessibility, including new restrooms, with a focus on equity. This will include all-gender restrooms with baby & adult changing stations.

28. Comments

The County values community heritage by investing in the preservation of historic structures, while actively repurposing them to meet contemporary community needs, which positions Ellicott City for a strong future. Funds from this grant will specifically support interior renovations and finishes, bringing new life to interior spaces in support of the adaptive reuse. The plan concept for the courthouse complex calls for an adaptive reuse as a Center for Arts, Culture and History - with an emphasis on pedestrian and open space connections. Key to this plan is that the courthouse property should emphasize complementary uses rather than competitive to the retail mix that currently exists along Main Street.

The Howard County Center for the Arts will provide a place where people of all ages and skill levels can develop and learn, artists can work and teach, and community arts organizations can establish themselves and grow. Each year, nearly 40,000 visitors browse through the galleries, take a class, or attend an event at the Center.

The AAPI Cultural Center will include a lounge and social space, exhibit space, offices, and dance/martial arts studio. The AAPI population has grown considerably over the last decade, with Asian residents now making up 20% of the county (7% State of Maryland). The Center will become a hub where Asian Americans can form coalitions, help people apply for citizenship and encourage them to register to vote, a one-stop referral center for Asian residents many of whom are new immigrants who are seeking access to social programs and other resources. The establishment of an AAPI center is a positive signal to the community that they are valued as an integral part of society in Howard County, once again enveloping this historic building into the national narrative of equity and inclusion.

The Roving Radish, a Howard County Government program, promotes healthy eating habits in our community by providing affordable meal kits; supports local farms by creating sustainable new markets to help them grow and continue farming in our community; and connects the community in a common effort to support local farmers and supply healthy meals to our residents, especially those in need.

Additionally, the project will pay homage to the site's historic use as a Courthouse by preserving the original Courtroom 1 as a community room / flex space, which can be used by community organizations in addition to the building occupants.

The completed project is intended to have programming 7 days a week, during daytime hours; with occasional evening programming of the black box theater or community spaces. It will have fully ADA accessible restrooms, at least 285 parking spaces, and be directly accessible from public transportation.

Finally, the location will support the potential establishment of an Arts & Entertainment District in Howard County with the new center serving as the arts anchor.
