The Mount City Elks Lodge

173 West All Saints Street

From 1919 to 1928 the building was 15 bed-hospital for blacks. Established by Dr. Ulysses Bourne and Dr. Charles s. brooks, the facility admitted patients denied care at the Frederick City Hospital until the opening of the Baker wing in 1928. Although remodeled to the mid-20th century with its imitation stone front exterior and large single-paned windows, this brick structure is unified across the front with a classic example of an Italinate-style bracketed cornice and frieze. The placement of the double sidewall chimneys (seen in the alley) indicates an earlier history as prominent Federal or Greek Revival style residence,
