<b>10. Description and Purpose of Organization</b> (Limit length to visible area)					

Round House Theatre is one of the three largest theatre companies in the state of Maryland, and we serve more than 50,000 patrons annually through theatre performances and arts education programs. Our innovative artistic endeavors, impactful education and engagement programming, and lasting social and economic impact have contributed to the vibrancy of Maryland's artistic reputation for nearly 50 years. Mission: Round House is a theatre for everyone. We enrich our community through bold, outstanding theatrical and educational experiences that inspire empathy and demand conversation. We work to reflect the diversity of our county and region through the playwrights whose work we produce, the artists who work on our stage, and the audiences who attend our performances and education programs.

## **11. Description and Purpose of Project** (Limit length to visible area)

Round House is requesting \$500,000 in capital funding as a first step to acquire and fit out a new scene shop. Our current shop, leased to us by Montgomery County since 1983, is located in the gym locker rooms of a former junior high school. Designed for our former location on Bushey Drive, it is now insufficiently sized to match the size of Round Houses stage. As a result, scenic construction and painting begins in our shop, but must be finished and assembled on Round Houses performance stage. This uses up six weeks in our theatre, which could otherwise be used for revenue-generating activity. A new scene shop will allow us to add those six weeks back to our performance schedule. These added weeks will also provide a crucial expansion of our earned income stream by as much as \$1 million. This additional income and other savings provided by the project will help solve significant budget issues that are affecting arts orgs in the wake of the pandemic.
