10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)					

The West Arundel Swim Club is a not-for-profit organization located in the Maryland City Community with over 250 family memberships servicing more that 1,500 members per year. The West Arundel Swim Club, which was opened in 1964, offers a 25-yard, six lane competition swimming pool with a diving well and a division winning swim team. The swim club also offers multiple sessions of swim lessons each year to individuals within the community and surrounding areas. The facility includes recreation activities such as Volleyball, Basketball, table tennis, a playground area (with Swings, Spring animals, and sandbox), a covered and uncovered picnic and BBQ areas and a fenced in baby pool area.

The description of this project is to install a new building which includes two family changing rooms that meets the requirements to provide an American with Disabilities Act (ADA) area so that members and guests requiring ADA amenities have restrooms that they can safely use. In addition to the ADA bathhouse, the project includes redoing the floors in the Ladies and Men's bathhouse and the drains in the front of the bathhouse. The ADA bathhouse would be a welcome addition to our Senior Citizen members and guests that attend our Senior Citizen Water Aerobics Classes. In addition to the drainage issue, we would replace the floor of the pavilion picnic area that now has trip hazards due to the age of the pavilion floor. In addition, a new fence around the property for safety and a new LED Sign.

ADA Compliant / Family Changing Rest Room

The description of this project is to install a new building which includes two family changing rooms that meets the requirements to provide an American with Disabilities Act (ADA) area so that members and guests requiring ADA amenities have restrooms that they can safely use. In addition to the ADA bathhouse, the project includes redoing the floors and the plumbing in the Ladies and Men's bathhouse and the drains in the front of the bathhouse. Fixing the shower drains and the front deck drainage issues will allow members and guests to enjoy the facility without the possibility of slipping in standing water due to the draining problem. Two years ago, the membership approved and funded the installation of an ADA Pool Lift to assist our disabled and senior citizen members' capability to enter and exit the pool. The ADA bathhouse would be a welcome addition to our Senior Citizen members and guests that attend our Senior Citizen Water Aerobics Classes. In addition to the drainage issue, we would replace the floor of the pavilion picnic area that now has trip hazards due to the age of the pavilion floor.

New Fence for Safety

Part two of this project is to replace the 59-year-oldfencingaround the facility to ensure the safety of the members and guests at the Swim Club as well as the community at large. New LED Digital Sign

The final part of this project would be to install a double sided 10 mm LED Digital display sign with electric from the building to the sign. The sign will allow the Swim Club to advertise events occurring at the pool which will also be lighted and have the ability to be broadcast during evening hours. The sign would also be able to broadcast emergency information to the entire Maryland City community.
