This pavilion, equipped with electricity and restrooms, will accommodate diverse needs, ensuring ADA compliance and supporting family bonding and community involvement. As the YMCA partners with nearly 35 other local nonprofits, it could serve as a hub for collaborative initiatives. Adjacent to Head Start classrooms, it will provide enriching family activities. With a daily enrollment of nearly 1,000 children in summer camps, the pavilion will alleviate capacity constraints, offering a safe outdoor environment for recreational activities. Its construction represents a commitment to community well-being and engagement, reinforcing the YMCA's mission of empowering individuals of all ages and abilities.
