Education - State Library Resource Center - Funding

This bill increases the per capita funding amount that must be provided to the State Library Resource Center (SLRC) beginning in fiscal 2025. **The bill takes effect July 1, 2024.**

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: General fund expenditures increase by \$616,500 in FY 2025 increasing to \$632,800 in FY 2029; future year increases reflect population growth. The State budget includes funding for the enhancement in FY 2025. Revenues are not affected. **This bill increases a mandated appropriation beginning in FY 2026.**

Local Effect: Although local library systems benefit from SLRC funding, local finances are not materially affected.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Bill Summary: The bill increases per capita State aid for SLRC by \$0.10 beginning in fiscal 2025. **Exhibit 1** compares per capita State aid under current law and under the bill.

Current Law:

State Library Network

Since 1888, the State has provided funds to support public libraries throughout the State under what is now known as the State library network. The network consists of the Central Library of the Enoch Pratt Free Library System in Baltimore City, three regional resource centers, and metropolitan cooperative service programs. All these systems receive State funding for operating expenses.

The Central Library of the Enoch Pratt Free Library operates as the designated SLRC. The funding level for SLRC is set at \$1.97 per resident. The fiscal 2025 State budget includes \$12.9 million in funding for SLRC, which includes \$775,800 in enhanced funding over the current law amount.

Maryland State Library for the Blind and Print Disabled

The Maryland State Library for the Blind and Print Disabled (LBPD) provides comprehensive library services to eligible blind and physically disabled residents of Maryland, which includes individuals who are legally blind, visually or physically limited, or reading disabled. The library is part of the national network of the National Library Services for the Blind and Print Disabled through the Library of Congress. The National Library Services selects and produces recordings of full-length books and magazines for a network of libraries providing alternative format materials. LBPD supplements the National Library Service collection with large print books, descriptive videos, children's braille books, and tactile materials such as maps, atlases, and art books. Books are lent on a wide range of subjects in braille, audio, and large type. The service is free, statewide, and SB 434/ Page 2

can be provided to individuals via the U.S. mail. Approximately 8,400 Maryland residents receive the services provided by the library annually.

LBPD must receive an amount equivalent to at least 25% of the general fund appropriation received by SLRC under the required per capita funding amount. Based on the current budgeted amount for SLRC, the minimum State funding level for LBPD totals approximately \$3.2 million. However, the fiscal 2025 State budget includes \$3.5 million in funding for LBPD, which exceeds the minimum statutory required amount.

State Expenditures: As shown in **Exhibit 2**, State formula aid for SLRC increases by \$616,466 in fiscal 2025 and, based upon current projections for population growth, by \$632,837 in fiscal 2029. Since the current State funding level for LBPD exceeds the minimum statutory required amount, the enhanced funding for SLRC is not projected to impact the level of State funding provided to LBPD. The fiscal 2025 State budget includes funding for the enhancement in the first year.
