House Bill 565 Judiciary (Delegate Simmons, et al.)

Judicial Proceedings

Correctional Services - Investigation of Suspected Homicide - Reporting

This bill requires the Department of State Police (DSP), by December 31 each year, to post on its website and submit to the Governor and the General Assembly a report detailing the following information for the preceding calendar year: (1) the number of investigations completed by DSP – pursuant to current law – relating to the death of an incarcerated individual suspected to be a homicide that occurs while the incarcerated individual is in the custody of the Division of Correction (DOC) whether within or outside a correctional facility; and (2) the number of cases referred by DSP for prosecution following a completed investigation.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: DSP can handle the bill's requirements with existing budgeted resources. Revenues are not affected.

Local Effect: None. Local government finances and operations are not affected.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law: DSP must investigate any death of an incarcerated individual suspected to be a homicide that occurs while the incarcerated individual is in the custody of DOC whether within or outside a correctional facility. DSP may act within the limits of a municipal corporation that maintains a police force when conducting such an investigation.
