Port of Baltimore - Renaming

This bill changes various references in State law that refer to the "Port of Baltimore" to instead refer to the "Helen Delich Bentley Port of Baltimore."

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None. The bill is technical in nature. The Port of Baltimore was renamed as the Helen Delich Bentley Port of Baltimore in 2006.

Local Effect: None.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law: The Maryland Port Administration (MPA), through its efforts to increase waterborne commerce, promotes the economic well-being of the State and manages the State-owned facilities at the Helen Delich Bentley Port of Baltimore. MPA is governed by its Executive Director and the Maryland Port Commission.

According to the <u>Maryland State Archives</u>, in June 2006, Maryland Governor Robert L. Ehrlich, Jr. announced that he had officially renamed the Port of Baltimore as the Helen Delich Bentley Port of Baltimore.
