#### State Board for Professional Engineers - Engineer Members - Qualifications

This departmental bill reduces the number of years (from 12 to 10) that an engineer member of the State Board of Professional Engineers must have practiced engineering.

## **Fiscal Summary**

**State Effect:** None. Altering the qualifications of board members does not affect governmental finances.

Local Effect: None.

**Small Business Effect:** The Maryland Department of Labor (MDL) has determined that this bill has minimal or no impact on small business (attached). The Department of Legislative Services concurs with this assessment. (The attached assessment does not reflect amendments to the bill.)

#### Analysis

**Current Law/Background:** The State Board of Professional Engineers consists of eight members (six engineers and two consumer members). Among other specified requirements, each engineer member of the board must have (1) practiced engineering for at least 12 years and (2) been in responsible charge of important engineering work for at least 5 years.

MDL advises that the current 12-year requirement could be considered a barrier to allowing younger individuals to serve on the board. By allowing earlier-career professionals to

qualify for service on the board, the pool of qualified candidates could expand, thus resulting in greater racial, ethnic, and/or gender diversity on the board.

Furthermore, MDL notes that the modification will bring the board into closer alignment with recent requirements established by the <u>National Council of Examiners for Engineering</u> and <u>Surveying</u> (the national organization that develops and scores the exams for professional engineers and surveyors).
